CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIP 2019

The ACC Cross Country Championships will once again be taking place at Bundoora Park.

Date : Wednesday 11th September, 2019

Venue : Bundoora Park, Plenty Road Entrance, Bundoora

Starting Times :

Ages : Age groupings will be taken from 1st **January** of the current year, as per rule 2.1 of ACC Handbook

Teams : A team will consist of a maximum of **10 competitors**.

Uniform : All runners must wear correct College shorts and singlets.

Spikes : Will not be permitted. Students wearing spikes will be disqualified.

The Course : There is a 2 km loop and a 3km loop. The **3km races** complete one loop of that course. The **5km races complete the 2 km loop first and then finish with the 3 km loop.** The map of the course is provided at the end of this document.

Starting Positions : All competing Colleges have been given a position on the start line according to the draw (see below). **Competitors will be called to the start line 5 minutes before the starting time for a briefing.** It is the responsibility of the coaches to ensure all their runners are ready to race when called.

- Results :** “OZ Timing” will be in charge of results this year and will be using electronic timing and finish line recording software for results management. Each athlete will be provided with a race bib with an ID number that will be used in determining finish line order and subsequent results. These race bibs are weatherproof and tear resistant. Each Team Manager is to collect a plastic container with their school’s race bibs from the Event Management Marquee upon arrival at Bundoora Park and ensure that each participant is correctly fitted before reporting to the start line. Each participant will need to attach the race bib to the front of his school singlet using 4 safety pins. The pins should be placed through the 4 small holes in each corner. Once participants finish their race they are free to move back to their school area. The race bibs will need to be collected after each race by the Team Manager and returned at the conclusion of the event.
- Spectators :** It is vital that all spectators on course are properly supervised. In past years we have had issues with spectators running alongside competitors urging them on, which leads to some confusion for course marshals. At no stage is any spectator allowed to run alongside competitors – those doing so will be reported to course marshals and may result in a protest against the school involved. If at any stage a spectator needs to cross the track, they should ensure that they take great care not to disrupt the race in any way. The starting and finishing areas are to be kept clear of spectators at all times. Any spectator on course is to ensure that they are not dressed in their school’s running attire – this could lead to confusion for course marshals and result in either a protest or disqualification for the school involved.
- Protests :** Must be lodged within **15 minutes** of the completion of the race.
- Results :** **The first six runners from each team will gain points.** The team with the lowest score will be declared the winner of each race. All results will be updated live on the ACC website (www.accmelb.com.au) as well as listed on the electronic scoreboard near the finish line.
- Officials :** **All competing Colleges are to supply 2 officials.** These staff will act as course marshals. Names of your officials must be submitted by Monday August 26th. On the day, all officials should report to **Dom Scarpino** and **Rosie Welsford** at the Event Management Marquee no later than 10.15 am.
- Toilet Facilities :** There are adequate toilet facilities but there are no change rooms. Competitors should come dressed ready to run. Portable toilets and water station will also be available for athletes and spectators.
- Parking :** Will be advised on the location map.
- Presentations :** The presentation ceremony will take place after the last race. It is courteous for all schools to remain behind where possible for the presentation of awards. Banners and pennants will be presented to the Champion school in each age group and section, as well as for the overall winners in both divisions. We will also present individual awards to the first three place getters in each **race** (inclusive of both divisions).
- Photography:** There will be two ACC appointed photographers working on the day. A link will be provided to all schools post event with access to download high res copies of all images from the event. School based photographers must ensure that they do not interfere with the runners whilst on course, and must remain behind the barriers at the finishing zone.

- Videography:** An event highlights video will once again be produced and made available to schools a few days following event day.
- Clean Up :** Colleges are responsible for cleaning up their areas. There will be bins at the venue.
- First Aid :** First Aid services will be provided and can be found next to the Event Management Marquee near the finish line. We will also have a mobile first aid unit available on course. For any first aid assistance, please contact one of the course marshals with a radio or phone Paddy McKenna on 0433 282 445.
- Shelter :** Shelter will be provided for the recording officials. All schools will need to provide their own shelter for their participants.
- Lunch :** Lunch will be provided for all officials. A coffee van will be present for hot drinks. Officials will be provided with complimentary drinks, with vouchers available from the event management marquee.
- Race Bibs :** All competitors are required to wear the official ACC race bib. These can be collected by your ***Team Manager*** from the Event Management Marquee. Pins will also be provided, but schools are encouraged to also provide some spares of their own. All race bibs will need to be collected by the Team Manager and returned at the conclusion of the event. Pins need to be removed and placed in the plastic box provided, and the race bibs stacked neatly in numerical order and returned in the plastic container.

2019 Cross Country – Team Submission Procedure

This year we will once again be using automatic results software to manage the timing and results for the ACC Cross Country Carnival. This service will be supplied by OZ Timing, a company that has worked extensively in the field of event and results management. To enable the efficient processing of results, we need to have all of the competitors' details included in the database prior to the event. The simplest method of doing this is to complete the excel spreadsheet, "Team Submission Template" and then email it to the ACC office.

As part of this system, all athletes will be supplied with a race bib that they will attach to the front of their school athletic singlet (A sample is included in this package). The race bibs will only have an ID number. The bibs will be collected at the conclusion of the event and re-used for future ACC cross-country events.

To ensure that all information is correct, you will need to submit your completed Team Submission Sheet by **6PM MONDAY SEPTEMBER 9TH**. Information from all 12 schools will then be collated and sent to OZ Timing to complete the software database. Please note that this deadline is only two days prior to the event, so please try to have your team lists as accurate as possible. **If this deadline is not met, your school will not be able to compete in the event.** You can only list a maximum of 10 athletes in each age group – a maximum of 60 athletes from your school. An event entry list will be distributed to all schools, with all athletes allocated an ID number.

On the day of the event, your Team Manager can collect all of your school's race bibs from the Event Management Marquee upon arrival. It is essential that race bibs are put on correctly – **four** safety pins per race bib on the front of the athlete's singlet. It is also important that the correct race bib is given to each athlete in preparation for his event.

INFORMATION TO BE SUBMITTED

An Excel team submission template spreadsheet will be emailed to you with this package. On the spreadsheet you will notice that there are three sections to be completed for each age group: **School; First Name; Surname.**

Please enter the information for each athlete using **CAPITAL LETTERS.**

Only 10 athletes per age group can be listed.

Athletes competing above age groups – As per rule 3 in the General Carnival Rules in the ACC Handbook, it is possible for an athlete to compete in a higher age group for the Carnival, provided that he only competes in one event. If it is known prior to the event that you will have an athlete competing above his age group, simply include his name **in age group he will be competing in** when submitting your team. If an athlete needs to be changed to a higher age group on the day, you will need to complete the change of entry form included in this package.

If an athlete will be competing on the day that has not been submitted on the original sheet, you will need to register them at the Event Management Marquee at the start of the day by completing a change of entry sheet.

RACE BIB INSTRUCTIONS

Each athlete will be provided with a race bib with an ID number that will be used in determining finish line order and subsequent results. The race bibs have an electronic transponder that is recorded as the athletes cross the finish line. Team Managers should check each bib as it is distributed to ensure that it is not damaged. Please also ensure that each athlete is correctly fitted before reporting to the start line. Each athlete will need to attach the race bib to the front of his school singlet using the **4 safety pins** provided with each bib. The pins should be placed through the 4 small holes in each corner (marked in the sample below).

As athletes cross the finish line, their time and place will be automatically recorded and points allocated to their school. The OZ Timing finish line arch will be placed directly above the finish line so that it will be clearly visible as athletes approach. Once each athlete finishes, they will need to keep moving forward and out of the finish zone so that the finish line area does not become too crowded as other athletes finish the race. The race bibs should be collected by the school's team manager, as they will need to be handed back to the ACC event manager at the conclusion of the day.

Race bibs will be allocated to schools in groups of 10 for each age group. They will not have athlete details (name, etc) - there will be an ID number only. It is very important that the correct race bib is given to the athlete that is registered to that number. A confirmation list will be provided to each school prior to the day. If a change of entry is required, then the new athlete that is replacing the athlete that has been withdrawn must be given the same number. Each school will only be allocated 60 race bibs in total (10 per age group).

The promotion and relegation system is applicable to this championship event, but is not automatic. Promotion from Division 2 up to Division 1 only occurs if the aggregate score across all age groups is higher than that of the last placed school in Division 1. If the score is not higher, then there is no change for the following year's event.

MELWAYS MAP REFERENCE: 19 F4

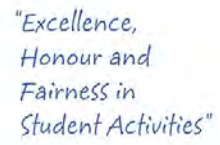

21. General ACC Carnival Rules

1. CARNIVAL DIVISIONS.

- 1.1 For Athletics, Swimming and Cross Country, Colleges will compete for points in their own Divisions. A Division Two College cannot win a Division One Aggregate Award. Division make up of Carnivals are detailed below. (25/11/02)

Athletics (2019)

Div One: DLS, PAR, SBE, SBM, SJG, WFD

Div Two: CBC, EMM, MAZ, SAL, SIM, SJF,

The school finishing last in Division 1 will be relegated to Division 2 for 2020, with the school finishing first in Division 2 promoted to Division 1 for 2020.

Swimming (2019)

Div One: DLS, MAZ, PAR, SBE, SBM, SJG, WFD

Div Two: CBC, EMM, SAL, SIM, SJF

The school finishing last in Division 1 will be relegated to Division 2 for 2020, with the school finishing first in Division 2 promoted to Division 1 for 2020.

Cross Country (2019)

Div One: DLS, PAR, SBE, SBM, SJF, SJG, WFD

Div Two: CBC, EMM, MAZ, SAL, SIM

Promotion and relegation between divisions will only occur in Cross Country if the last placed team in Division 1 has a higher aggregate score than the first placed team in Division 2 (ie a lower score is a better result in Cross Country).

2. AGE LIMITS

- 2.1 Age groupings for swimming, athletics and cross country shall be taken from 1st January of the current year. eg. To be eligible for the Under 14 category a student will turn 14 years of age during the year. The age limit for Open competition shall be under 19 before 1st January of the current year.
- 2.2 Primary School students from ACC Colleges may participate in any Carnival subject to clearance by ACC Executive Officer. (15/4/02)

3. COMPETING ACROSS AGE GROUPS.

- 3.1 In Swimming, Athletics and Cross Country, a representative must compete in his own age group or an age group above determined by his date of birth, except in an event which is not provided for in that age group, in which case he may compete in that particular event in the next higher age group, which offers it. (11/10/04)
- 3.2 Should a school wish to place a student in an age group higher than for which he is eligible, that student must remain in that age group for that particular carnival (11/10/04)

4. PROTEST COMMITTEE.

Protests regarding events shall be in writing and given to the Executive Officer or the appointed Event Manager within fifteen minutes of the result of the disputed event. If the protest involves schools in Division 1, then the protest committee shall comprise no less than four Directors of Sport from Division 2. If the protest involves schools in Division 2, then the protest committee shall comprise no less than four Directors of Sport from Division 1. The Protest committee shall seek advice from relevant officials concerning the protest but will make the final decision. The decision of this protest committee shall be final with the presiding Executive Officer having a casting vote in the case of equal voting.

5. CHANGE OF DATES.

Should an urgent situation that suggests the need to change the date of a carnival become known to a Director of Sport or Principal in the final 48 hours before its scheduled commencement, the Executive Officer shall be notified immediately; and he will notify the President, who will consult, as far as possible, with the Principal of each participating College and resolve the matter as early as possible. If the date of a Carnival has to be changed, the new date must be mutually agreed to by the Principals of all competing schools.

6. UNIFORM.

Each College shall see that its competitors are attired in the appropriate athletic uniform.

7. SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT (26/11/18)

7.1. All spectators at ACC events are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct that has been approved by Principals. This policy applies to current students, former students, staff members, parents and members of each school community. It is the responsibility of each individual school to pro-actively address expectations around spectator behaviour, to closely supervise the members of their school community at each event and to address any behaviour in breach of the Code of Conduct.

7.2. Spectators at ACC sporting events must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants and other spectators, focusing on the enjoyment of sport and the effort of each participant.

7.3. CHAMPIONSHIP EVENTS

The traditional “cheer squads” are no longer part of the accepted spectator policy for ACC championship events. Schools are welcome to have groups of student spectators in attendance, providing the following criteria is met:

7.3.1. The ACC Sport Spectator Group application form is completed online (<https://form.jotform.co/81717521976869>) at least a week prior to the event;

7.3.2. Detailed information is provided in that application, including the anticipated number of students, transport arrangements, staff supervision details and contact information;

7.3.3. Approval is granted by the Executive Officer;

- 7.3.4. Either full school dress uniform OR full school sports uniform is worn by each student (no dress ups, costumes or old / ripped uniform items to be worn);
- 7.3.5. Spectators are not permitted to have loud hailer, whistles, drums, trumpets or any other musical instruments;
- 7.3.6. Strict silence at the start of each event is essential. Courtesy should be shown at all times during announcements, especially for the presentations of trophies;
- 7.3.7. Each school is to take responsibility for the cleanliness of their area. Students should be asked to clean up their areas prior to leaving;
- 7.3.8. Each College shall ensure student spectators and staff remain for final presentations;
- 7.3.9. After finalisation of results, no students are to enter the venue presentation area unless invited to do so for official group photographs.

7.4. SCHOOL BASED ACC EVENTS

It is suggested that the home school arranges a representative (student or staff member) to welcome visiting teams when they arrive and guide them to the relevant sporting venue. Every visitor should be made to feel welcome and should not be subject to a negative experience when visiting another school. This role could be allocated to the staff member on yard duty (provide them with prior notice), or a non-playing student that is involved with the home team.

- 7.4.1. **EXPECTATIONS AROUND ACC COMPETITION** Whilst sport is based on competition between individuals or teams, that competitive element should not be the overriding factor in the school sport environment. Conduct of the team and each person associated with the team plays a critical role in the success of ACC sport. There are strict rules about student behaviour and also rules governing the conduct of coaches and spectators. These rules can be found on the ACC website under: SPORTS & EVENTS / Codes of Conduct. It is vital that these guidelines for conduct are adhered to.
- 7.4.2. **STAFF SUPERVISION – SPECTATORS** The supervision of student spectators is an important part of making visitors feel welcome at your school. Our sporting program does not encourage a tribal mentality, and the home school students should never try to create an intimidating environment for visiting teams. Active supervision by your school's staff and student leaders will help to create an enjoyable atmosphere for all concerned. One of the great aspects of sport is the active involvement of spectators. Their support can add significantly to the sporting experience of the players, but adversely can also distract them from "focussing on the ball" and at times encourage actions that do not align with our focus on fair play and sportsmanship. The conduct of one or two individuals can reflect very poorly on your entire school community. Play your part in upholding the reputation of your school and actively monitor the conduct of those around you. (26/11/18)

8. SEATING ALLOCATION FOR SCHOOLS.

For Swimming and Athletics, the Executive Officer will ensure that allocated seating positions for Schools are rotated at least three positions in a clockwise direction each year.

9. MOST IMPROVED AWARD

The “Most Improved Award” is awarded to the school with an enrolment under 1000 students based on the difference in the average point score over the preceding three years and the points achieved at the current year’s event. The school with the greatest increase is to be presented with a banner at the conclusion of the Carnival.

23. Cross Country

1. The Championships shall be held before the end of the Third Term.
2. Teams shall consist of not more than ten competitors per age group. The first six members to finish shall gain points. Each College shall field one team in each age group. Age groups shall be - Senior, Under 17, Under 16, Under 15, Under 14, Under 13.
3. Course
 - 3.1 The Carnival organiser will ensure that all Colleges will have an equal and fair opportunity at the race start and for the duration and finish of each race.
 - 3.2 At the start, Division One and Two schools are to be lined up in two separate groups on the starting line with schools to be rotated within those groups one space after each race.
 - 3.3 Should any student be found guilty of cheating or cutting off parts of the course the official protest committee shall have the power to add 50 points to the aggregate score total of the student's offending team.
4. Aggregate Awards
 - 4.1 The Phil Hackett Cup for Division One shall be presented to the College gaining least aggregate points. (26/11/07)
 - 4.2 A Championship Cup for Division Two shall be presented to the College gaining least aggregate points from those Colleges.
5. Section Awards & Medallists
 - 5.1 The Brother Joseph Bouchard (Division One Senior) Perpetual Cup will be presented to the school gaining the least number of points for Division One in the Senior and U 17 divisions. The Division Two Senior Cup will be presented to the school gaining the least number of points for Division Two in Senior and U 17 divisions.
 - 5.2 The Martin Hickey (Division One Intermediate) Perpetual Cup will be presented to the school gaining the least number of points for Division One in the U.16 and U.15 divisions. The Intermediate Division Two Cup will be presented to the school gaining the least number of points for Division Two in the U.16 and U.15 divisions.
 - 5.3 The James Delahunt (Division One Junior) Perpetual Cup will be presented to the school gaining the least number of points in the U.14 and U.13 divisions. The Division Two Junior Perpetual Cup will be presented to the school gaining the least number of points for Division Two in the U.14 and U.13 divisions.
 - 5.4 Medals shall be presented to the first three place getters in each age group, irrespective of division. These medals are presented in lieu of having no official records with Cross Country (18/11/11).
6. The Senior, Under 17 and Under 16 events will be contested over a course of 5000m. The Under 15, 14 and 13 events shall be contested over a course of 3000m
7. Starting times for events are to be determined by the carnival organiser:

8. In the case of any team not having a full team of six competitors finish the race, each non-competitor will be awarded the points of last place plus one point. For e.g. If there are 73 competitors in a race and one school has one competitor short, then that non-competitor will be allocated 74 points. The same points allocation would also apply if a team had two or more competitors short in that race. (6/6/08)
9. Competitors are not permitted to wear spikes.
10. No sports equipment (EG balls/bats) is allowed at the Cross Country and boys are to be instructed about this prior to the Carnival. (25/11/02)

CROSS COUNTRY

The Phil Hackett Cup (Division One Aggregate) was first presented in 2008 – Mr. Hackett was a member of staff at St. Bede's from 1976 – 2002, during which time he coached their Cross Country team to 17 Division One titles over 26 years.
